“GOT DROUGHT? The Impact of Drought on Wells & Landscaping” was the subject of a panel discussion on Wednesday, 11 April, 6:30-8:30 pm, Temple Town Hall. The event was co-sponsored by the Temple Conservation Commission and Mansfield Public Library of Temple.

A panel of experts described drought affects wells and landscapes and what residents can do to prepare for drought and minimize harm when it happens.

The “Get Drought” panelists were be Stacey Herbold, Water use and Conservation Manager NHDES; Andrew Koff, Hydrogeologist and Community Well Siting Program Manager, NHDES; and Anita Stevens, Certified Landscape Manager and Member, Milford NH Conservation Commission.

The panelists presented topics related to well health and water conservation. The commission handed out water testing kits to residents interested in having their well water tested.
